Project Summary

The objectives:

- On the short term: identify, support and finance the first project holders.
- On the medium term: expand to other projects through reinforced links with the NGO Partners present in Lebanon.

Location: Alissar headquarters are established in France since October 2020. This will be followed by the installation of a twin association in Lebanon in January 2021.

Partners: around six potential associative Partners have already been identified in Lebanon with a sharing of common values.

Timeline:

- October 2020: Creation of Alissar France
- December 2020: Identification of initiatives and selection of pilot projects.



Lebanese current context

- Lebanon is currently witnessing a <u>humanitarian</u>, <u>social</u>, <u>economic</u>, <u>financial</u>, <u>health</u> and <u>identity</u> crisis.
- 40% of the population is unemployed. 58% of the population is below the poverty line, of which 22% are in extreme poverty.
- Lebanon is witnessing decreasing tax revenues, rising inflation, deteriorating poverty, and galloping devaluation of the Lebanese pound.
- The double explosion of August 4, 2020 has left hundreds dead and thousands injured, 300,000 homeless. It has pulverized the centre of the capital and inflicted severe damages throughout the city. The human and material toll was very heavy and the explosion has paralyzed the port and several companies.
- Economic activity has been drastically slowed down, not only in Beirut, but throughout the country. According to World Bank estimates, the explosion caused between 3.8 and 4.6 billion dollars in damages and between 2.9 and 3.5 billion dollars of financial losses.
- Lebanon needs to support its civil society with resources that it cannot access due to this widespread crisis.
- Lebanon needs a new look at life with a differentiated way of thinking and approach.



Presentation of the policies implemented in Lebanon


- Many NGOs (about 250) are already present on the national and international scene in support of civil society.
- These NGOs address different sectors:
 - 1. Civil protection
 - 2. Medical emergencies
 - 3. Education
 - 4. The reconstruction of the country
 - 5. The emancipation of women
 - 6. The care of the elderly and of people in a situation of disability
 - 7. The fight against famine
 - 8. Support for refugees





Malfunctions & challenges

- Lack of involvement by municipalities and governmental departments.
- **Banking restrictions** and capital controls, leading to the lack of confidence in the banking system.
- Extreme insecurity due to this multi-faceted crisis and an urgent need for action at all levels (macroeconomic and microeconomic).
- A challenge to rebuild a sustainable entrepreneurial environment at the microeconomic level. Need for a differentiated approach that favours local know-hows, solidarity and respect for the environment, in order to overcome the current crisis and support promising ideas for Lebanon.

Project Description

- Call for project proposals, open to cooperatives, small businesses, non-profit organizations and municipalities in Lebanon.
- Provision of funding, advice and support to grant recipients following a rigorous selection process.
- Direct provision of equipment and trainings to local groups to help them start or expand a business.
- A focus on economic development in order to improve the standard of living of individuals and their families and by that, the local socio-economic fabric.
- The association is initially financed by the own funds of its founding members. Apart from small structural costs such as the local working team, all donations received will be used for the realization of projects, which will in turn contribute to the improvement of the Lebanese civil society.





Objectives

- To bring, thanks to the funding and expertise provided by its members, supporters and the Lebanese diaspora, technical and financial assistance to the selected projects (new initiatives or existing enterprises to be developed).
- To launch microeconomic activities and synergies while waiting for the structural and multi-sectorial reforms desperately needed by the civil society.
- To establish academic links between France and Lebanon in the field of the solidarity based economy

Communication

- Communications with the institutions specialized in "empowerment" across all regions and communities in Lebanon.
- Campaigning through Social Networks



Granting Conditions

- Investment in projects carried out by one or more people working under a cooperative or a company, that will lead to improvements in employment, the environment, exports, quality of life, etc...
- The project must:
- 1. Present a clear benefits for the community as a whole, beyond a single individual
- 2. Benefit low-income or underserved communities in Lebanon.
- 3. Use up to 70% of the Lebanese resources
- 4. Use Lebanese know-how
- 5. Create jobs for the youth
- 6. Environmental friendly


